is chamber music theatre work for singing actress and trio, based on the lives of three legendary

Latin American women: renowned Mexican painter Frida Kahlo, Salvadoran peasant-activist Rufina Amaya
and Argentine poet Alfonsina Storni. The text is by award-winning Chilean writer Marjorie Agosin.

The musical score, performed by the Core Ensemble (cello, piano, percussion), includes arrangements of popular
and folk music from Latin America, music by tango master Astor Piazzolla and new music by composers
from Argentina, Mexico and Cuba. Tres Vidas includes images of Frida Kahlo's dramatic visual work, passages
from Rufina Amaya's heartfelt testimony about the ravages of the Civil War in El Salvador and excerpts
from Alfonsina Storni's passionate poetry. In addition to the evening-length show, the ensemble offers
residency programming for students of Women's Studies, Latin American culture, music, and theatre.
